UPV trusts partners to check their students' language background thoroughly. Most of our partner universities require incoming exchange students to prove that they have at least level B1 of CEFR (mostly B2 or even C1) of the language of instruction. We expect the same.

Keep in mind that language experts generally recommend 120-180 hours of class and several months of practice for the B1-B2 levels of CEFR.
