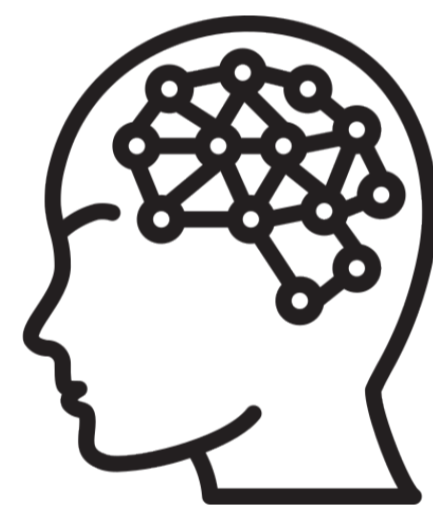

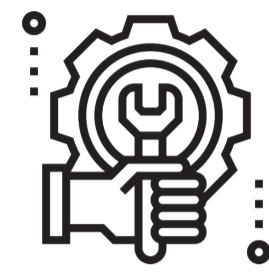

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## INCENTIVES AND POSITIVE REINFORCEMENTS

### Resources and Infrastructures



The student must have access at university to common spaces and workshop to develop their projects. In addition, they should have at their disposal tools, technicians and guides that support them during their stay at the institution

### Dynamic Environment
