

Welcome to València!

Located on the shores of the **Mediterranean sea** and surrounded by lush farmland, **València** (spelled with an "accent obert"!) is the **capital of the Valencian Community**. Also known as "el Cap i Casal" or the capital of the Turia river, it's a vibrant city with more than 800,000 inhabitants (around 1.5 million people counting the whole metropolitan area).

Originally founded as a small Roman colony on a river island, València has always been a key population hub. Over the centuries, it's become a melting pot of many different cultures, and you can notice this rich history in the architecture, traditions and cuisine, among others. Must-see historical spots include the Almoina Museum, the Banys de l'Almirall, the Cathedral and its iconic Micalet bell tower, the Lonja de la Seda building, and the Serranos and Quart Towers. You'll also find more recent gems like the Mercat Central, the iconic Estació del Nord, Plaça Redona, and the iconic and futuristic City of Arts and Sciences.

Full of history, art, and culture, València was even named the best city in the world to live in by Forbes in 2023 and 2024. These days, it's buzzing with life and packed with things to do. You can stroll through the Turia Gardens, take a dip at Malvarrosa beach, wander the lively neighbourhoods of Russafa or El Carme, dive into the city's vibrant nightlife, enjoy a real paella in the Albufera, explore local food markets, or tune into some live music.

Whatever you're into, València has something for everyone. Trust us, it will turn into the perfect backdrop for all the unforgettable memories waiting to be made during your Erasmus adventure.

Something to consider: València has a **Mediterranean climate**. The average temperature in the coldest month of the year (January) oscillates around 7 °C, while in the hottest month (August), temperatures rise up to 35 °C on some days. Consider this when packing!

04What to do

Valencia is a dynamic city with a **thriving cultural scene that offers something for everyone**. Throughout the year, it hosts a wide range of activities and events that celebrate its **rich heritage**, **contemporary creativity**, **and vibrant community life**. Whatever your personal interests are, the city's cultural calendar is always full of opportunities to explore and connect.

Some activities we recommend you to look into:

- Going to the opera.
- Visiting the theater.
- Experiencing a football match (or any other main sport event).
- · Attending concerts (both small or big).
- Checking out some music festivals: Big Sound, Festival de les Arts, Festivern, Festardor...

Main festivities taking place in the city:

- Sailor's Holy Week in Cabanyal (starting on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the spring equinox).

Before your arrival

Student-Tutor Program.

The **UPV's Office of International Exchange Programmes** provides multiple services for incoming exchange students. One of them is a **Student-Tutor program** that matches each Erasmus student with a **local mentor/buddy**.

These mentors will:

- Help you understand your schedule and choose the right courses.
- Explain how the **Spanish academic system** works (classes, exams, assignments, internships...).
- Support you in the search for accommodation.
- Inform you about transportation and everyday life in the city.

The office will assign you a mentor automatically, and it is managed through the AIRE platform on the Intranet. The assigned mentor will contact you via email, introducing themselves and providing a channel to ask any questions. They will typically study in the same faculty as you, so they can better understand your doubts and offer the most relevant support.

If by any chance you haven't been assigned a mentor before your arrival, you should **contact your faculty's International Relations Office** (as mentioned **further on**).

How to find housing.

València has become a popular city for students, so **rental prices have greatly increased** in recent years. Nonetheless, the **average monthly rent for a room is around 450€**, but **it can range from 200€ to 500€** depending on the area, size, and conditions.

Utilities (electricity, water, heating, etc.) usually cost **around 100€ per month total**, which means **20€ to 80€ per person when shared**. You can check estimated living costs in València on **this webpage** (know that it's geared towards adults, so costs may be lower for students following a simpler lifestyle).

Most landlords require a **deposit** when signing the rental contract. This is a sum paid upfront as a **guarantee in case of damages or unpaid rent.** The standard deposit is 1 or 2 months' rent, but for temporary stays like Erasmus, it's usually just 1 month. The deposit **should be returned at the end of the rental if the apartment is in good condition**. We recommend taking photos or videos of the apartment at the beginning of your stay and keep written proof (emails, messages) to document its original state.

If you're renting through an **agency**, they often charge a **commission fee**: typically **1 month's rent + 21% VAT (IVA)**. Some online platforms include listings from both private landlords and agencies. It is important to keep in mind **private landlords should not charge you any commission fees**, as it goes against the current law.



<u>Spotahome</u> is a renting house platform that focuses on **students and young people**. **ESN provides a 25% discount**. Their service offers a full online system that is divided into 4 steps:

- 1. Find and choose your ideal home with detailed photos, videos, and neighborhood info. Check the owner's terms before booking.
- 2. **Book the property**: The owner has 24 hours to accept. Your initial payment is charged automatically and held until 48 hours after your move-in. A **small service fee** applies.
- 3. Confirmation: Once accepted, you'll be contacted to arrange key collection and submit required documents.
- 4. Move-in day: Pick up keys, sign the contract, and start your stay. Initial payment transfers to the owner 48 hours after move-in. A deposit and any extra fees must be paid at contract signing.

For the discount, use the promotional code "ESN25" at checkout.

<u>Live4Life</u> is a rental platform tailored to **students and young people**, offering a streamlined **three-step procedure**:

- Online process: Huge database of available houses submitted by owners. Each house profile includes location, price, availability, equipment (appliances, heating, utilities fees...), rules, requirements, photos, 360° tour, and an assigned advisor to assist you.
- Reservation: Once you choose your desired house, you reserve it by paying the first month + management fees.
- Acceptance + Contract: The owner has 48 hours to accept the reservation, then paperwork begins. If rejected, Live4Life will offer similar options or refund all your money if you don't find a suitable one.

<u>MiCampus</u> is one of the biggest student residence companies in Spain, offering **modern housing** in **excellent locations**.

<u>InLife</u> is another housing platform with a fully online process, ideal for Erasmus students booking from different countries. The process has **2 steps**:

- Search: Find your dream house in the database, with help from online operators.
- **Reservation**: Reserve or contact the owner and make the first payments. If rejected, your money is fully reimbursed.

Other popular platforms in Spain include <u>Uniplaces</u>, <u>Idealista</u>, <u>Fotocasa</u>, <u>Erasmusu</u>, <u>Habitelle</u>, <u>Cuvi</u>, <u>Badi</u>...

ESN València UPV also runs a **WhatsApp community** to help Erasmus students find roommates in the same situation. To join, message us on **Instagram at @esnvalenciaupv**, and we will send you the link.



Some tips to ensure you don't get scammed:

- Never send money before seeing the apartment in person or via videocall.
- Be cautious with very cheap listings or ads without real photos.
- Always ask for a written rental contract, even for short stays.
- Take pictures at the beginning and end of the rental period as proof of the apartment's condition.
- If possible, speak to previous tenants or look for reviews of the landlord or agency.
- Use secure paying methods like bank transfers, and make sure to keep all the receipts.
- If a landlord claims to be "abroad" and offers to send keys through a third party, it's likely to be a scam.

O The Universities

Universitat Politècnica de València.

The Polytechnic University of València (UPV) is a public Spanish university, considered the best Polytechnic University in Spain, and among the very best in the world by multiple rankings. It is heavily focused on science, technology, and fine arts. It is made up of 3 campuses and 14 schools and faculties.

University life at UPV is full of surprises and fun activities. Throughout the academic year, you'll often find **exhibitions**, **games**, **festivals and food giveaways** to enjoy for free or even join in as an organiser.

Vera Campus (València)

This is the main campus, and it is located in the north of the city of València, in a calm and green environment. More than 60 buildings surround the Ágora, the heart of the university, with green areas exceeding 108,000 m².

The sport facilities include an indoor pool, sports pavilion, gym, athletics track, "trinquet" (the field where "pilota valenciana", the local sport, is played), velodrome, and multiple tennis and paddle-tennis courts.

Other facilities you might find are the many cafeterias, as well as libraries, museums, printing services, ATMs, art supply and stationery shops, healthcare centre, pharmacy, optitian's, hairdressers... Everything you could possibly imagine to ensure your in-campus experience is as comfortable as possible!



Gandia Campus (Gandia)

Located in **Grau de Gandia**, close to the beach and the port, this campus offers **specialised laboratories** for a wide range of fields, such as **acoustic chambers**, **chemistry labs**, and **TV studios**.

It also features a building with **conference rooms** and the **Aula Magna** (Main Hall), which hosts **conferences and large-scale events**. Additionally, the campus provides **sports facilities** for various disciplines and the **Learning and Research Resource Centre (CRAI)**, which includes a large library and spaces for **research**, **teamwork**, **and language self-study**.



You can also find many facilities that will make your in-campus experience better, such as cafeterias with affordable menu options, its main library with individual cabins and group-study designated areas, printing facilities, healthcare centre and sport courts.






Alcoi Campus (Alcoi)

The Alcoi Campus is the last of the three campuses of the Polytechnic University of Valencia (UPV), and it is located in the historic center of the city of Alcoi (Alicante).

This Campus is mainly divided between the buildings of the former Ferrándiz and Carbonell factories. The School of Engineering of Alcoi stands out for its strong engagement with the local social and business environment, as well as its active participation in numerous research, development, and innovation projects.



Unlike other campuses, the Alcoi Campus is integrated into the city centre, giving students direct access to everything they might need. From local cafés and restaurants to shops, libraries, and public transport, everything is just a short walk away. In any case, the Carbonell building hosts the Main Library, while the Georgina Blanes building allocates the sports pavillion, gym, and parking facilities.

Velluters Centre

Its Campus is located in the Velluters neighborhood, within the Valencia's old town, near the Torres de Quart. Until the 19th century, this area was home to the textile industry workshops, where numerous artisans produced silk and especially velvet ("vellut" in Valencian), which gives the neighborhood its name. This historical legacy connects with the center's current role in Higher Design Studies and its technological outlook toward the future.

- Assembly Hall: with a capacity for over 120 people, used for conferences, round tables...
- Library: housing over 10,000 volumes on design, art, and general culture.
- Photograpy Studio: available for students to rent for assignments and personal projects.
- Exhibition Halls: two spaces that host exhibitions by professionals, students, and alumni.

Vivers Centre

Its Campus accounts for the original headquarters of the School (back in the day known as the School of Applied Arts and Artistic Trades). It is located in the **Vivers neighborhood**, on Pintor Genaro Lahuerta Street, named after a distinguished artist and former director of the school. This centre sits just across from the **Jardines del Real**, a large green space that once housed the Royal Palace of Valencia.

- Assembly Hall: a multipurpose room with a capacity for over 100 people, equipped with high-tech systems for optimal presentations.
- Library: features an extensive collection focused on photography, cinema, applied arts, and jewelry.
- Photography Studio: available for students to rent for completing assignments and personal projects.
- Digital Manufacturing Lab: offers students the ability to develop physical prototypes using laser cutting, engraving, or 3D printing.

7/Important Paperwork

Immigration Documents

You will need to check whether you need a **visa or permit** to study in Spain. This depends on **your nationality** and, if applicable, the **terms and conditions of your current residence permit** from your home university. You can find detailed information in **this link provided by your to-be-host university**. If you do need a visa, **your host university will assist you** with the necessary procedures that will most likely follow.

Medical Insurance

You must have valid medical insurance for the **entire duration of your stay in Spain**. You have two options:

- **OPTION 1**: European Health Insurance Card (<u>EHIC</u>), for students from EU/EEA countries. It grants free access to Spain's public healthcare system under the same conditions as Spanish nationals. Make sure your EHIC is valid through the end of your mobility period. Contact your national health provider to obtain or renew your EHIC.
- **OPTION 2**: Private Health Insurance, required for non-European students, or if you do not have an EHIC. The insurance document must include your name, be valid until the end of your stay, and clearly state coverage in Spain, Europe, or worldwide.

Minimum Coverage Requirements:

- · All students:
 - Medical benefits: At least €50,000 (accident, illness, medication, hospitalization).
- Non-European students additionally need:
 - Emergency medical transport to home country: At least €50,000.
 - Repatriation of remains to home country: At least €50,000.

Note for European Students:

Even if your university only checks for your EHIC, Erasmus+ also requires **civil liability coverage** and other **travel assistance services** (you should receive this information from your sending University). We would recommend you to take on some **travel insurance policy** that includes civil liability, medical repatriation, repatriation of remains and (ideally) coverage for a family member's travel expenses in case of hospitalization.



OBHow to move around the city

Valencia is a well-connected city, making it easy to get around both locally and beyond. Its public transportation system (including buses, metro, and trams) is extensive, affordable, and generally punctual. The city is also very walkable and bike-friendly, allowing you to move comfortably and efficiently through its vibrant neighborhoods.

Assuming you arrive at València's airport, the most comfortable and cost-effective method to reach the city would be by metro. Following the signs you will arrive at Metrovalencia's ticket machines, where you will be able to get the ticket. Don't hesitate to ask for help at the desk. A single ticket to the city center will cost you 4'80€.

To move around the city using public transport, you have a **few options**:

• If you need to take multiple means of transport.

MOBILIS30: monthly youth card (for 15 to 30-year-old people). It includes unlimited use of metro, metro-bus and EMT buses, and has a monthly cost of 14'90€. To obtain it, you will need to upload the required documents in this link. For foreigners temporarily residing in Spain, a residency certificate from the local police is required, which you can get at any local police station. We feel compelled to inform you, the card takes a long time to arrive.

• If you need to only take the underground/tram.

TUIN Jove: rechargeable metro youth card (for up to 30-year-old people). It **only includes metro service (no buses)**, and there's a **15% promotion** (by paying 4'25€ you will recharge 5€). **Each time you validate the ticket it will be 0'80**€ (2€ if you are travelling from the city to the airport).

There's other fares as well: check out which one suits you best here.

If you need to only take buses.

EMT Jove: rechargeable bus youth card (for up to 30-year-old people). It only includes bus service (no underground/tram), and has a monthly cost of 12'50€.

There's other fares as well: check out which one suits you best here.

If you want more freedom (or cost-effectiveness).

Valenbisi is a bike rental service that has very good coverage throughout the entire city. Since València is very flat and well provided of bike lanes, many spots that may seem pretty far away are reachable in less that 30 minutes, which is the time limit before having to refresh the rental in order to not get charged by the hour anyway.

Its **cost for an entire year is 29'21€**, and we highly recommend it as an **always-reliable**, **ecofriendly and healthy alternative** to other public transportation options. You can subscribe to the service <u>here</u>.

9 Emergency contacts

You will see, València is an **overall safe city**, very much in line with the average crime rate of other spanish cities (which luckily is pretty low). Still, **moving to a new country comes with many challenges**, and we want you to feel **protected and informed** at all times. That's why we've put together this quick guide, with **key contacts and instructions** on what to do in case of **emergencies**, **health issues**, **or situations of vulnerability**.

Medical emergencies and health support.

Health issues.

If you have any health issue, the **European Health Insurance Card** (EHIC) will cover your expenses. If you come from outside the EU, make sure to bring your **private health insurance documentation**. Contact your provider to check which hospitals are covered under your plan. **Find the closest health centre here**. For serious situations, call 112 or go to the nearest emergency room.

Sexual transmitted infections and medical testing.

If you wish to get tested for STIs or other infections, you can find a <u>list of local centers here</u>. You can also visit <u>OpenHouse clinic</u> and get a **25% discount on all tests with your ESNcard**.

Mental health and psychological support.

If at any given point you're struggling emotionally, **please reach out**. Adapting to a new country, culture, or language can be overwhelming:

Lost or stolen documentation

If you lose your documents or they get stolen:

- 1. Go to the police station and file a report.
- 2. Include all missing items in detail.
- 3. Visit your embassy or consulate in València to get temporary documents or guidance. <u>Find your consulate here.</u>

Sexual or anti-LGBTQ+ violence cases

Sexual assault.

If you are a victim of sexual assault, please follow these steps:

- 1. Call someone you trust and dial 112 for emergency support.
- 2. Do not wash your hands, change your clothes, or brush your teeth.
- 3. Go to a health center and ask for a medical report.
- 4. Follow the instructions provided by healthcare staff.

For **specialized assistance**, you can call <u>+34 900 22 00 22</u>, a 24/7 helpline for sexual violence survivors.

Gender identity or sexual orientation-biased assault.

Bias-motivated violence against LGBTIQ+ people is considered a hate crime in Spain. If you or someone you know suffers such an attack:

- 1. Call the police immediately and file a report.
- 2. Go to a hospital and ask for a full medical examination.
- 3. Report all symptoms, even those that could seem minor.

Your voice matters, and your comfort and safety will always be a priority to us.

You can share any **concerns** you may be having **or report an incident you witnessed** through the following google form. Remember **you're not required to include your name**, it can be submitted anonymously if that makes you feel more comfortable:

And remember, if you see...

- 1. Changes in mood or behavior (withdrawal, anxiety, fear).
- 2. Someone avoiding specific people, places, or activities.
- 3. Comments about feeling unsafe or being treated unfairly.
- 4. Visible physical injuries or distress.
- 5. Witnessed **inappropriate behaviors** (unwanted touching, offensive jokes, pressure, insults, isolation).

Make sure to...

- 1. **Ensure the person's immediate safety**. Move to a safe space if necessary.
- 2. **Listen without judgment**. Show empathy, stay calm, and never minimize their experience.
- 3. Do not force them to share details. Let them decide how much they want to say.
- 4. Offer options: reporting the incident, contacting support services, or speaking to someone they trust.

Encourage the person to report the situation in the corresponding way of the ones listed above. **Offer to accompany them if they choose to report it** to the police, university services, or other organizations.

Don't ignore, delay, or downplay any situation. **Don't confront the alleged aggressor** yourself without coordination. **Don't promise outcomes you cannot guarantee**. The focus should always be on supporting the affected person and ensuring that the situation is handled with care, respect, and discretion.

Lastly, we feel compelled to remind you: ESN volunteers are not qualified to attend emergencies. If you have an emergency of any sort, please contact the numbers we provided above. We will always try to help you out, but there are a lot of situations that fall completely out of our hands. Please, rely on true professionals for these more complicated situations.








Living sustainably in València
