

Study Abroad Applications

Application and Nomination Deadlines:

- Semester 1 (Fall or Full Year):31 May
- Semester 2 (Spring or Calendar Year): 31 October

Supporting documents:

- Current official university transcript (3.0 Cumulative GPA)
- Passport ID-page scan
- Personal statement
- English language qualification (if required)

Students that do not meet our 3.0 CGPA requirement should request their home university's Study Abroad Adviser to contact us to discuss their nomination.

English Language Requirements

In order to study with us, your English must be good enough for you to succeed in your classes. There are multiple ways you can demonstrate this.

If you are coming for only one semester, we may be able to accept certification from your home university as evidence of your English level. Please contact us on studyabroad@le.ac.uk, and we can look into the matter for you.

Requirements by Subject

- Chemistry, Computer Science, Engineering, Geology, Mathematics, Physics, and English Language: IELTS 6.0 with a 5.5 in each skill.
- Law: IELTS 6.5 with a 6.0 in writing and a 5.5 in reading, listening, and speaking.
- Geography: IELTS 6.5 with a 6.0 in each skill.
- All other subjects: IELTS 6.5 with a 5.5 in each skill.

Equivalent scores in TOEFL and other accepted English tests and qualifications can be found via the link to the left.

Test results must be no more than 2 years old.





Visas

Student Visa

Students coming to the UK for more than 6 months will need to apply for a Student Visa.

Students applying for a Student Visa will be required to demonstrate that they have money for any course fees, plus a specified amount of money for each calendar month of their course to cover their living costs. For more information visit:

Standard Visitor Visa

Students joining us for less than 6 months may be able to enter the UK with a Standard Visitor Visa. Visa Nationals will need to apply for the Standard Visitor Visa in advance.


Students taking modules in Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Engineering, Geology, Informatics (Computer Science), and/or Mathematics are required to remain on campus and sit examinations in the exam period. No exceptions can be made.

Examination dates

- Semester 1 exams take place in early-to-mid-January.
- Semester 2 exams take place in May.

Welcome Programme

We run a Welcome Week at the beginning of each semester (September and January). During Welcome Week, you will be able to attend our Welcome Talk, complete registration, and confirm your modules. A schedule will be available to you before you arrive.




Module Restrictions and Timetables

At the University of Leicester, we call the individual classes or courses that you study "modules". As a Study Abroad student, you can apply for modules from a wide range of academic fields.

All module requests are considered on a case-by-case basis. You must meet any academic pre-requisites and English language requirements for your modules, and modules may become full or unavailable without prior notice. If you are not able to take a preferred module, we will work with you to find a suitable replacement that meets your academic needs.

You will be able to see your module timetable after you arrive in Leicester. You may find you have scheduling clashes between your modules. This is more likely if you select classes from different levels (i.e., 1000, 2000, 3000, etc.) and/or departments. If you are seeking credit transfer, we recommend that you have a full list of approved alternative modules in case you need to change your modules after you arrive on campus. There will be a two-week window at the start of the semester when you can make these adjustments.





Accommodation

We have three vibrant housing locations for students: Oadby Student Village, City Living, and Freemen's Common. Oadby Student Village is approximately a 40 minute walk from the main campus, with a free shuttle bus available during term-time. Shops and a supermarket are nearby, as is the University's Botanical Garden. City Living and Freemen's Common are approximately a 5 to 10 minute walk from the main campus. All halls offer social events for students throughout the year.

Accommodation is guaranteed for students who apply before 1 September (for students starting in Semester 1) or mid-December (for students starting in Semester 2). An initial payment of £250 is required to secure the booking.

Contracts

Incoming Study Abroad students are able to select from two contract types: a shorter one that includes just the teaching period and a longer one that includes the exam period.

Students only need to stay for the exam period if they are taking modules in Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Engineering, Geology, Informatics (Computer Science), or Mathematics.

If you are unsure which contract you need, we strongly recommend that you apply for the shorter contract because you will be required to pay the room fee for the full length of your contract even if you leave early. You can always extend your stay if you wish.



Costs
