

ANNEX II. STATEMENT OF SPANISH LANGUAGE SKILLS (BY HOME UNIVERSITY)

UPV trusts partners to check their students' language backgrounds thoroughly. We kindly ask partner institutions to be serious and realistic about their students' level of Spanish.

Starting from the 2026–2027 academic year, UPV will no longer accept certificates signed by the home institution stating that the student commits to improving his/her Spanish before arriving at UPV, or certificates of ongoing (unfinished) Spanish courses.

No additional Spanish language certificates will be accepted after the application period closes (May 15, October 15). The only exception is the Faculty of Fine Arts.
