# Procedure to complete Master's Thesis

# Step One - Choosing a Master Thesis (MT) Topic

The first step is crucial: finding a topic that excites you. To do this, contact the master's program professors and discuss possible topics.

Choose one that motivates you and aligns with your interests and professional goals.

### Step Two – Submitting the Topic Proposal

Once you've chosen your topic, it's time to formalize your proposal. This should include a summary of the work to be carried out.

Upload the proposal to the Ebrón application within the deadlines established for each academic year. The academic committee will review your proposal to ensure it meets quality and suitability criteria.

## Step Three – Working on the MT

Now begins the most exciting part: working on your MT. Dedicate yourself with passion and effort to the research and development of your project.

Remember that the written report must not exceed 80 pages.

Also prepare a clear and concise presentation to defend your work.

### **Step Four – Submitting the MT**

Once your MT is complete, upload the report through the Ebron application.

There are four submission periods each academic year, so make sure to submit your report within the established deadlines.

Students who wish to defend their MT in a specific session must notify the administrative services of the Department of Electronic Engineering and upload the PDF version of their MT to the "Ebron" application, complying with the deadlines set for each session.

# Step Five - MT Defense Before an Academic Committee

Two committees will be formed for the evaluation of the MT, one for each specialization, composed of three members appointed by the Academic Committee from among the PhD holders teaching in the master's program.

If a student and their MT supervisor believe that the MT should be defended, for academic reasons, before the committee of a different specialization than the one the student has pursued, they must submit a reasoned request for a change of committee to the administrative services of the Department of Electronic Engineering, with a copy to the academic director of MUISE. This request must be made at the same time the student communicates their intention to defend the MT in a specific session.

The MT will be defended before the designated committee. The committee chair will inform the ERT of the date, time, and location of the defense so that students who have requested to defend in that session are notified in advance.

The MT presentation will last a maximum of 15 minutes, followed by a Q&A session with the committee.
